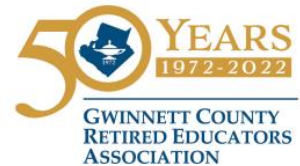

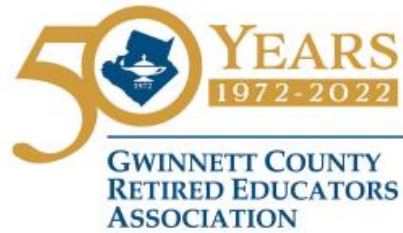

## FROM HUMBLE BEGINNINGS

Back in 1972, Gwinnett County Retired Educators got its start at the old Educational Building in Lawrenceville, GA. A representative from the State Department of Education, Retired Teachers Division, and one from the Retired Teachers Association of the Ninth District met with thirteen retired Gwinnett County teachers to organize our Gwinnett County unit. Mr. T. Carl Buice was elected as the first GCREA president.

Today, 50 years later, GCREA is a large and thriving organization which is involved in many charitable endeavors, a successful scholarship program and interesting and informative monthly meetings at the beautiful Sugarloaf Country Club in Duluth.

We currently have 527 members, many of whom are scattered across the United States. Of those, 284 are Lifetime members, sometimes making it difficult to keep track of them and where they are. The Lifetime membership was instituted at a time when our organization needed an influx of money, so the one-time dues of \$160 was offered. This provided the seed money for our investment program which provides funding for our scholarship program. However, our Board decided to drop this membership option last year since its original purpose no longer exists.

With the cooperation of GCPS accounting Dept., we have been able to offer the ADD (Automatic Dues Deduction) option to members who taught in Gwinnett. Their annual dues of \$25 is deducted from the monthly retirement check at the rate of \$2.09 per month. This option provides a convenient way to pay dues a little at a time. No hassle, no worry! We currently have 156 ADD members. This means the county sends our treasurer a check each month for a little over \$300. Multiply that times 12 and it comes to approximately \$3,900. Not bad, huh!!

Our regular members, which currently number 87, are sent an annual statement each June and they then send in their dues check of \$25. If all rejoin for another year, that is another \$2,175 added to our treasury. Although we lose a few members each year due to a variety of circumstances, we continue to add new members and our numbers always seem to grow.

As we enter the next 50 years in existence, we need to remember that in order to keep our organization strong, we must continue to add new members. That is where each of us comes into the picture! So, ask your retired teacher friends and colleagues to consider joining GCREA. We are a great organization, and we need a strong voice to keep our retirement situation strong and intact!

## 50 Years of Memories of GCREA by Carolyn Fetner

I moved to Gwinnett County in the summer of 1970 to be the librarian at Lawrenceville Elementary School, so although I was not a member of GCREA, I do remember when it was formed. I think they used to meet in the Female Seminary on Perry Street in Lawrenceville.

My mother, Mary Guiney, moved to Gwinnett in 1972 at age 60 after retiring as a librarian in West Virginia, but she was soon hired to become the library clerk at B. B. Harris Elementary where she worked until age 70. At that time, she joined GCREA where she was an active member until her death at age 102. Surprisingly, she was not the oldest emeritus member since Harriet Coffee outlived her by one year. Harriet taught at Lawrenceville Elementary when I was there, and she was a delightful lady!

For many years, mother rode to GCREA meetings with Annie Frances Flanigan who was one of the first teachers to be televised teaching lessons on public television. Annie Frances was definitely a groundbreaking educator. She was also GCREA President in 1984-85.

When I retired from Dyer Elementary in 2003, one of the first things I did was to attend GCREA meetings with mother and join as a life member. One of the most memorable longtime members was Jane Alexander. Jane was not a charter member, but she was one of the first presidents in 1980-82. Jane always wore colorful suits with matching hats. I can't imagine how many hats she owned! Jane died in 2018 at the age of 98.

For many years, GCREA met at Hamilton Mill Golf Club. When it was sold, GCREA began a quest to find a suitable meeting venue. These included Payne-Corley House in Duluth, Destin Events in Suwanee, Northwood Country Club in Lawrenceville, Apalachee Farms Clubhouse in Dacula and now (and hopefully for a long time) Sugarloaf Country Club in Duluth. There were also occasional meetings at Lawrenceville Methodist Church and Lawrenceville Depot necessitated when venues were either sold or went out of business. Through it all, GCREA has continued meeting, even during the pandemic, often online using Zoom. Hats off to our officers who kept it going now and through the past 50 years!
